

## Comments concerning proposed rulemakings

I disagree with the entire concept of these supposed "weather emergencies". Those of us who operate in District 10 (Panhandle) have contended with extended periods of sub-freezing weather all our lives. If your duties as a child included caring for livestock (as mine did 60 years ago) you soon learned what you had to have and what you needed to do to keep animals alive that, ultimately, kept your family and YOU alive. We rarely lose much production to cold weather. Now days, however, we OFTEN lose production because of pipeline failures. Years ago, if a gas plant lost electric power, the only problem was no light in the bathroom, engines, valves, and gages were all gas operated with PEOPLE on hand 24-7 to operate and maintain the facility. Now, the pipelines (and everyone else, it seems) want to operate remotely and that means ELECTRICITY. The only "emergency arising from cold weather events arises from loss of electric-dependent components that were installed for convenience and to use fewer PEOPLE with no regard for extreme weather reliability. Question #1, are you going to send your people out in sub-zero weather to check on us? Question #2 after those employees tell you to take a hike when you ask them to go out and work in sub-zero temps, are YOU going to join us on location? see you there.......We will be working in all kinds of weather with the tools, supplies, and knowledge necessary to do all that is prudently possible just like we have for many decades, in spite of the time wasted submitting forms containing information you already have on file.
