If any language herein modifies or conflicts with general language on the same subject matter in the rules and regulations tariff, the specific language in this tariff will control. (see exceptions herein)

The provisions published herein will, if effective, not result in an effect on the quality of the human environment.

This tariff publication is filed in compliance with 18 CFR 342.3 (Indexing).

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RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following is an exception to Item 10, Specifications as to Quality & Legality of Shipments, in R.R.C. No. 57, and reissues thereof. The additional paragraphs will apply to this tariff.

ITEM 10 SPECIFICATIONS AS TO QUALITY & LEGALITY OF SHIPMENTS

Petroleum Products will be accepted for transportation at such time as Petroleum Products of similar quality and color are currently being transported from origin points to destinations along Carrier's line and meet the specifications issued by Carrier in its specification manual provided upon request.

Carrier may require that shipments of high sulfur (off-road diesel) be followed by shipments of fuel oil no. 1 or no. 2 or motor gasoline to displace high sulfur line fill in order to provide efficient and equitable operation of the pipeline.

The following is an exception to Item 25, Nominations and Minimum Volume, in R.R.C. No. 57, and reissues thereof. The additional paragraphs will apply to this tariff.

ITEM 25 NOMINATIONS AND MINIMUM VOLUME

The minimum volume of any one Petroleum Product of quality and specifications described herein which will be accepted at one point of origin from one shipper shall be [U] 5,000 Barrels.

Any shipper desiring pipe line transportation of Petroleum Products under this tariff, must, on or before the 15th day of the month, submit to Carrier a notice of shipment of the volume and type of Petroleum Products to be transported during the following month; otherwise, Carrier will be under no obligation to accept such Petroleum Products for transportation.

Shippers will be required to schedule their Petroleum Products for delivery into Carrier's manifold or suction manifold at point of origin to meet the cycle within which the Petroleum Product will move. Petroleum Product shall be available for shipment twenty-four (24) hours prior to the scheduled date for movement into Carrier's system.

Nominations for transportation of any specified Petroleum Product shall become operative in the order in which the Nominations therefore are received. However, since Petroleum Products are pumped in a certain sequence for efficient operation, Carrier reserves the right to specify the sequence of transportation of Petroleum Products.

The following is in addition to Items in R.R.C. No. 57, and reissues thereof and will apply to this tariff.

ITEM 135 DELIVERY ADJUSTMENTS

(a) Subject to the applicable rules and regulations tariff under the Items Measuring, Testing, and Deductions and Liability of Carrier, supplements and reissues thereof, Carrier shall account to each shipper for one hundred percent (100%) of products received.

(b) Carrier will dispose of interface received in Southlake, Texas in the following manner:

(1) The interface occurring between Petroleum Products having similar basic characteristics (compatible interface) shall be divided equally between the shipments which precede and follow the interface.

(2) The interface of Petroleum Products having dissimilar basic characteristics, which commingled product cannot be readily absorbed into the shipments immediately preceding or following the interface (non-compatible interface) shall be collected into a tank set aside for that purpose at the Southlake metering station. The total of such non-compatible interface material collected at Southlake in any calendar month will be allocated among the shippers. The interface material at Southlake will be sold on a bid or contractual basis for the account of the shippers, each shipper to be credited with its proportionate share of the net proceeds of the sale less transportation and handling charges.

(3) If a shipper so desires, his proportionate share of the commingled product will be loaded onto shipper's transporter at the Southlake terminal.

(4) The handling charge for either method (2) or (3) will be [U] fifteen cents \$0.15 per barrel of interface material loaded on transport.
