The narrative description and submitted maps (preferably at a scale of 1:24,000) should include information on existing features such as:
 - 1) roads, dwellings, and pipelines.
 - 2) surface water bodies.
 - 3) historic, topographic, cultural and drainage features.
 - 4) habitats of fish wildlife and plants, including any endangered or threatened species.
 - 5) topography.

The description and maps must also give information about proposed features, including:

- 1) trenches, roads, and other access routes.
- 2) buildings and other structures to be constructed.
- 3) land excavations, drill holes, and wells, including changes made to those already existing.
- 4) earth or debris disposal areas.
- D. Describe the method of exploration to be used (i.e., drill holes, pits or trenches, etc.), and the equipment used for exploration and related activities.
- E. Provide a description of the reasons for extraction of more than 250 tons of coal.
- F. Indicate the approximate time period during which exploration activities will be performed. A timetable estimate must be included which shows each phase of exploration and reclamation. Permits are issued for a period of one (1) year, and are renewable by application to the Commission.
- G. Provide a copy of the public notice to be posted by the applicant in the newspaper of general circulation in the affected county(s). Posting of this notice shall occur only after the applicant is notified by the Commission that the application is complete, whereupon proof of posting shall be provided by the applicant. This notice shall include the name and business address of the applicant, the filing date of the application, the address of the Commission to which written public comments can be submitted, the closing date of the comment period, and a description of the area of exploration.
